



Judges List Requirements



A1

Definition: judges who have previously been approved by the Kennel Club to award CCs in the breed, have completed their first appointment and have the support of the Bracco Italiano Society. **(KC Policy)**

A2

Definition: judges who fulfil all the requirements for the A3 list, who have been assessed in accordance with Kennel Club requirements and accepted by the Kennel Club for inclusion on an A2 list, and have the support of the Bracco Italiano Society. **(KC Policy)**

Requirements:

To have attended an Open Field Trial or an Open Gundog Test (GWT) for HPR breeds.

A3 (BREED SPECIALIST)

Definition: judges who are supported by the Bracco Italiano Society as being suitable to award Challenge Certificates in the breed, but not yet approved by the Kennel Club for inclusion on the A2 list.

Requirements:

1. A minimum of 7 years judging experience in the breed and to have the support of the Bracco Italiano Society. **(K C Policy)**
2. To have judged a minimum of 40 dogs of this breed in breed classes.
3. To have attended a seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer and passed the relevant examination on KC Regulations and Judging Procedure. **(K C Policy)**
4. To have attended a seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer on Conformation and Movement. **(K C Policy)**
5. To have attended at least one breed specific seminar run in accordance with the relevant Kennel Club Code of Best Practice and passed an examination and/or assessment where applicable. **(K C Policy)**

6. To have bred and/or owned a minimum of 3 dogs when they obtained their first entry in the Kennel Club Stud Book. (Save in exceptional circumstances) **(K C Policy)**
7. To have stewarded for 6 days at shows. **(KC Policy)**
8. To have attended a Points of a Dog seminar conducted by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer and passed the assessment. **(K C Policy)**
9. To have attended an Open Field Trial or an Open Gundog Test (GWT) for HPR breeds. **(KC Policy)**

A3 (NON SPECIALIST)

Definition: judges who are supported by the Bracco Italiano Society as being suitable to award Challenge Certificates in the breed, but not yet approved by the Kennel Club for inclusion on the A2 list.

Requirements:

1. A minimum of seven years judging experience in any one breed (to include five years in this breed) and to have the support of the Bracco Italiano Society. **(K C Policy)**
2. To have judged 40 dogs of this breed in breed classes
3. To have awarded CCs in at least one other breed. **(K C Policy)**
4. To have attended at least one breed specific seminar run in accordance with the relevant Kennel Club code of best practice and passed an examination and/or assessment where applicable.
5. To have attended an Open Field Trial or an Open Gundog Test (GWT) for Gundog Breed. **(K C Policy)**

B LIST (BREED SPECIALIST)

Definition: Judges whom the Bracco Italiano Society would support to judge Bracco Italiano at Championship shows without CCs or at Open shows.

Requirements:

1. Must have at least 5 years experience of owning at least one Bracco Italiano.
2. To have judged 20 dogs of this breed in breed classes.
3. To have attended a seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer and passed the relevant examination on KC regulations and judging procedure.
4. To have attended a seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer on conformation and movement.

5. To have attended a Points of a Dog seminar conducted by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer and passed the assessment. **(K C Policy)**
6. To have attended at least one Bracco Italiano Society Breed Specific seminar run in accordance with the relevant Kennel Club Code of Best Practice and passed the written examination.

B LIST (NON SPECIALIST)

Definition: Judges whom the Bracco Italiano Society would support to judge Bracco Italiano at Championship shows without CCs or at Open shows.

Requirements:

1. To have judged a minimum of 20 dogs of this breed in breed classes.
2. To have attended a seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer and passed the relevant examination on KC regulations and judging procedure.
3. To have attended a seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer on conformation and movement.
4. To have attended a Points of a Dog seminar conducted by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer and passed the assessment
5. To have attended at least one Bracco Italiano Society Breed Specific seminar run in accordance with the relevant Kennel Club Code of Best Practice and passed the written examination.

C LIST (BREED SPECIALIST)

Definition: Aspirant judges with an interest in the breed having owned a Bracco for 2 years, and have the support of the Bracco Italiano Society

C LIST (NON SPECIALIST)

Definition: Aspirant judges who do not fall into any of the above categories and have demonstrated an interest in the breed and have the support of the Bracco Italiano Society.
